# LIVONIA TOWN COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING

February 8, 2021 – 6:30 p.m.

The Livonia Town Council met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on February 8, 2021, at the Livonia Community Center, 3611 Lions Club Drive, Livonia, Louisiana. Mayor Rhett Pourciau called the meeting to order and directed Town Clerk Donna Bergeron to call the roll which resulted as follows:

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Mr. Pourciau, seconded by Mr. LeBlanc, and carried to approve and publish the minutes as written from the regular meeting on January 11, 2021.

#### APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried, to approve the treasurer's reports. Budget-to-actual was included for review and comments.

#### **APPROVAL OF INVOICES**

A motion was made by Mr. T. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. Watson, and carried, to approve the invoices for payment.

A motion was made by Mr. T. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. Pourciau, and carried to approve the invoices from Livonia Auto Repair for payment. Mr. G. Jarreau abstained.

#### RESOLUTION

A resolution was offered by Mr. Pourciau, seconded by Mr. G. Jarreau, and Resolved to authorize the Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem, and Municipal Clerk of the Town of Livonia, Louisiana to endorse all checks, drafts, and other items payable to and from this entity for the following accounts:

#### INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE

Mr. G. Jarreau made a motion to amend the proposed ordinance to add one used 2004 Chevrolet Pickup Truck to the list of surplus property. Motion was seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau and approved.

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried to introduce an ordinance declaring certain property as surplus property owned by the Town of Livonia. A public hearing will be held at the next regular meeting prior to consideration for adoption.

## **DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS**

## Police Report – Police Chief Landon Landry

In January, 419 citations were issued with 14 warnings. Three traffic accidents/incidents were worked and 63 complaints were answered. Fines collected for the month were \$43,165.

Chief Landry stated the department has received its first round of Covid vaccinations and the second round is scheduled this week.

The LA Cares Act no longer has funds available. Those much-needed funds were instrumental in keeping the department afloat last year.

## Drainage and Junk - Council Member Terry Jarreau

- A citizen on BMG Drive was concerned about a tree that is leaning over the canal behind her house that may fall across her fence. It was determined that the tree is on private property and not anything the town is responsible for or can legally remove.
- There is an area in the curve on David Street that is holding water. Pointe Coupee Parish Government has a grant to alleviate the drainage problems in that area. They are waiting on the funds to become available.
- Mr. Ricky Jarreau, 8813 Airline Highway, seems to be hauling more junk onto his
  property. He has been notified several times about the condition of the property. Will
  continue to address the problem.

## Public Works & Utility - Public Works Director Ricky David

Mr. David presented the Natural Gas Public Awareness notices to the council as mandated.

The sewer plant will be needing the sludge pumped out soon.

## **MAYOR'S REPORT – Mayor Rhett Pourciau**

Mayor stated that Arbor Clinic has been administering the Covid vaccine at the Livonia Community Center. Approximately 250 vaccines have been given.
