

**LIVONIA TOWN COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
July 11, 2022 – 6:30 p.m.**

The Livonia Town Council met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on July 11, 2022, at the Livonia Council Chambers, 3111 LA HWY 78, Livonia, Louisiana. Mayor Rhett Pourciau called the meeting to order and directed Town Clerk Donna Bergeron to call the roll which resulted as follows:

**APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A motion was made by Mr. LeBlanc, seconded by Mr. Watson, and carried to approve and publish the minutes as written from the regular meeting on June 13, 2022.

**APPROVAL OF TREASURER’S REPORT**

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried, to approve the treasurer’s reports. Budget-to-actual was included for review and comments.

**APPROVAL OF INVOICES**

A motion was made by Mr. T. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. G. Jarreau, and carried, to approve the invoices for payment.

**REQUEST TO CHANGE PROPERTY TO RENTAL**

A request by Ms. Stacy Gueho, Chauvin Rentals, requested the property located at 2982 David Street be changed to rental. Only the land will be rented until the lease-purchase is finalized in one year.

Mr. G. Jarreau made a motion to approve the request which was seconded by Mr. LeBlanc and carried.

**REVISIT POINTE COUPEE PARISH ANIMAL CONTROL PROPOSAL**

Mr. T. Jarreau made a motion to rescind a resolution adopted on June 13, 2022, approving to enter into a contract with Pointe Coupee Parish Government for parish-wide animal control due to full capacity issues at the shelter and further consideration. Motion was seconded by Ms. Pourciau and carried.

**DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS**

***Police Report –Police Chief Landon Landry***

In June, 408 citations were issued with 37 warnings. Two traffic accidents/incidents were worked, 3 arrests were made, and 65 complaints were answered. Fines collected for the month were \$39,839.

- Regarding the photo enforcement cameras, DOTD denied permitting the cameras. May use handheld equipment.
- Two defibrillators were donated to the police department by Pointe Coupee Health Services.
- A new police unit has been ordered this year that would not have been ordered until 2023 due to supply issues and state contract issues. It may take up to a year before it comes in.

***Drainage and Junk – Council Member Terry Jarreau***

The canal between Newfield Drive and Galtier Street was cleaned out by the parish. Mr. David Deshotel will cut the trees.

***Grass, Beautification, and Abandoned Buildings – Council Member Ron LeBlanc***

Due to the lack of progress on the demolition of the condemned house at 8813 Airline Highway by the owner, Mr. LeBlanc made a motion to move forward with the demolition by the town. Mr. G. Jarreau seconded the motion and was carried.

An update was given on proposed plans for health insurance benefits for retired employees.

***Streets and Water – Council Member Billie Pourciau***

Waiting for State's approval on the plans and specs to move forward on the main water line upgrade on Tiger and Tena Streets.
