DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Police Report – Police Chief Landon Landry

In September, 365 citations were issued with 4 warnings. Four traffic accidents/incidents were worked, 1 arrest was made, and 63 complaints were answered. Fines collected for the month were \$47,313.

Streets and Water Departments – Council Member Billie Pourciau

Pointe Coupee Councilman Kurt Jarreau informed her that there is significant road pavement damage on Steven Lane and the parish will take care of it.

Sewer and Abandoned Vehicles – Council Member Henry Watson

Two abandoned vehicles have been removed.

Public works and Utilities – Public Works Director/Operator Ricky David

Department has been busy with new water taps and several water leaks.

MAYOR'S REPORT – Rhett Pourciau

After reviewing many factors regarding cut-off (delinquent) fees on customer utility bills, including the time spent on addressing the monthly cut-offs, it's been 23 years since an adjustment to the fee has been made, and research as to what other utility systems are charging, a motion was made by Mr. LeBlanc to increase the cut-off fee effective January 1, 2022, to \$50 per account. Motion was seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau and approved unanimously.
