The Livonia Town Council met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on October 10, 2022, at the Livonia Council Chambers, 3111 LA HWY 78, Livonia, Louisiana. Mayor Rhett Pourciau called the meeting to order and directed Town Clerk Donna Bergeron to call the roll which resulted as follows:

AMENDMENT TO AGENDA

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried to approve and publish the minutes as written from the regular meeting on September 12, 2022.

APPROVAL OF TREASURER'S REPORT

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried, to approve the treasurer's reports. Budget-to-actual was included for review and comments.

APPROVAL OF INVOICES

A motion was made by Mr. LeBlanc, seconded by Mr. Watson and carried, to approve the invoices for payment.

CANDIDATE FOR STATE SENATOR

State Representative Jeremy LaCombe announced his candidacy to fill the vacant position of State Senator for this district after the resignation of Senator Rick Ward. He gave a brief summary of his accomplishments as Representative and asked for everyone's support.

REQUEST TO SUBDIVIDE PROPERTY – Ms. Alex Gabor

A request was made by Ms. Gabor to subdivide Lot C on Steven Lane into Lots C-1 and C-2. All subdivision of property requirements are being met therefore Mr. G. Jarreau made a motion to approve the request as presented. Motion was seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau and carried.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE

Mayor Pourciau opened the public hearing on a proposed ordinance relative to the amendment of motor vehicles and traffic enforcement photo-enforced fines. There was no public comment therefore the public hearing was closed.

TOWN HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT ARRANGEMENT (HRA)

Assistant Police Chief Kerry Gueho and his wife Michelle Gueho questioned the legalities of the town's HRA rules and regulations regarding privacy and the HIPPA law. After the Gueho's

expressed their issues, Town attorney Steve Marionneaux stated that all rules, regulations, and procedures in place for reimbursements comply with all laws. Mayor Pourciau stated since consulting and confirming the procedures are legal with an LMA attorney, the town's auditor, and Mr. Marionneaux, the present procedures are to remain in place.

ENGINEER'S REPORT – Mr. Gregg Gautreaux

Still waiting on approval of the plans and specifications from DHH to begin the water line improvement project along Tiger and Tena Streets.

The drainage project between BMG Drive and LeBeau Street will begin soon by Pointe Coupee Parish Government.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

Police Report – Police Chief Landon Landry

In September, 444 citations were issued with 9 warnings. Fifty-eight complaints were answered and seven accidents were worked. Fines collected for the month were \$56,850.

Each Council Member gave a brief update on their departments.

Trick-or-Treat will be held on October 31 from 6:00 p.m. until 7:30 p.m. throughout the town and at Glaser's Park. Glaser Subdivision will be closed to vehicles from 6:00 until 8:00 p.m. No trailers will be allowed on streets during this time.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Property insurance has gone up 113% from last year. Deleted a few minor things to bring the cost down.
