

**LIVONIA TOWN COUNCIL  
REGULAR MEETING  
September 11, 2023 – 6:30 p.m.**

The Livonia Town Council met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on September 11, 2023, at the Livonia Council Chambers, 3111 LA HWY 78, Livonia, Louisiana. Mayor Rhett Pourciau called the meeting to order and directed Town Clerk Donna Bergeron to call roll which resulted as follows:

**AMEND AGENDA**

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau to amend the agenda to include Mr. James Raub's property use proposal that would require rezoning. Motion was seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau and carried.

**THE FOLLOWING WERE APPROVED**

**MINUTES:** Motion by Mr. LeBlanc, seconded by Mr. Watson, and carried to approve and publish the minutes as written from the regular meeting on August 14, 2023.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Motion by Mr. T. Jarreau, seconded by Ms. Pourciau, and carried, to approve the treasurer's reports. Budget-to-actual was included for review and comments.

**INVOICES:** Motion by Mr. G. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and carried, to approve the invoices for payment.

**POINTE COUPEE PARISH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE**

Ms. Paula Lambert introduced herself as the new Executive Director of the Chamber of Commerce and gave a brief update on the upcoming events in the parish and about the new Chamber website.

**REZONING REQUEST PROPOSAL**

Mr. James Raub explained that he is interested in purchasing the property for sale at the corner of Bridge and Bayou Roads to place a food truck, make a small park with a water fountain, and a fishing pier, and have activities for the community. The property is currently zoned residential but would need to be rezoned as commercial to do the things he's proposing.

Mayor advised Mr. Raub to get a more detailed plan, meet with the Livonia Zoning Committee and Ms. Paula Lambert with the Parish Chamber if he wishes to move forward.

**ENGINEER'S REPORT – Mr. Gregg Gautreaux**

A motion was made by Mr. G. Jarreau to approve the request for payment of \$76,238.24 for water line improvements along LA HWY 78 by contractor JNGIII Construction. Motion was seconded by Mr. LeBlanc and approved, contingent on the state water sector program's approval.

**DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS**

***Police Report – Police Chief Landon Landry***

In August, 353 citations were issued with 19 warnings. Two traffic accidents/incidents were worked, and 44 complaints were answered. Fines collected for the month were \$88,682.55 of which \$30,375.55 of that amount was from handheld radar citation collections.

***Each Council Member gave brief updates on their departments.***

***Streets and Water – Council Member Billie Pourciau***

Ms. Pourciau thanked Assistant Fire Chief Evan Doucet for volunteering after a request was made by Beauregard Parish for assistance with the wildfires at Tiger Island. According to Evan, it was a very intense 63-hour stay there but 71% of the fires were contained by the returned home. It was the largest wildfire in Louisiana history.

***Sewer and Abandoned Vehicles – Council Member Henry Watson***

Representatives from Lt. Governor Billy Nungesser’s office visited the Indian Mound last month. More information is expected from them soon.

**MAYOR’S REPORT – Rhett Pourciau**

Trick-or-Treat will be held on Tuesday, October 31<sup>st</sup> from 6 – 7:30 PM. Party-at-the-Park will also be held at Glaser’s Park. Glaser Subdivision will be closed to traffic from Cooley to Thelma Street during this time.
