

**LIVONIA TOWN COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
March 9, 2026 – 6:30 p.m.**

The Livonia Town Council met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. on March 9, 2026, in the Livonia Council Chambers, 3111 LA HWY 78, Livonia, Louisiana. Mayor Rhett Pourciau called the meeting to order and directed Town Clerk Donna Bergeron to call the roll, which resulted as follows:

ABSENT: Council Member Lester Jarreau

THE FOLLOWING WERE APPROVED

MINUTES: Motion by Ms. LeJeune, seconded by Mr. Webre, and carried to approve and publish the minutes as written from the regular meeting on February 9, 2026.

TREASURER’S REPORT: Motion by Mr. T. Jarreau, seconded by Mr. Bergeron, and carried, to approve the treasurer’s reports. Budget-to-actual was included for review and comments.

INVOICES: Motion by Ms. LeJeune, seconded by Mr. Bergeron, and carried, to approve the invoices for payment.

VOTING CHANGES

Registrar of Voters Shanika Olinde and Clerk of Court Becky Miller explained recent changes to primary elections. The Louisiana Legislature now requires closed party primaries for certain races, ensuring that only registered party members (and unaffiliated voters) may vote in selecting their party’s candidates.

ANNUAL EASTER EGG HUNT

On behalf of Event Organizer DeEtte Leonard, Mayor Pourciau announced that the annual Easter Egg Hunt will be held at Glaser’s Park on March 28 and requested support from the Town.

Ms. LeJeune made a motion to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with Marlene Babin to provide face-painting services for the event at a cost of \$250. Mr. Webre seconded the motion, and it carried.

RESOLUTION

A resolution was offered by Ms. LeJeune to adopt the 2025 Municipal Water Pollution Prevention Audit Report for the wastewater treatment plant permit. Motion was seconded by Mr. T. Jarreau, and it carried.

ENGINEER’S REPORT –Wade Broussard, PE

Mr. Broussard stated that the new water well is currently being drilled.

The specifications for the sewer plant screen are ready. The estimated cost is \$500,000.

The water improvement line has been completed. A clear lien certificate and request for retainage payment from JNGIII Construction will soon be presented.

Mr. Bergeron made a motion to amend the agenda to approve the retainage payment. Ms. LeJeune seconded the motion, and it carried.

Mr. Bergeron then made a motion to approve the retainage payment upon submission. Mr. T. Jarreau seconded the motion, and it carried.

MAYOR’S REPORT

Enclosure of the guard rails along US HWY 190 west of the signal lights began last week.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS

Police Report –Police Chief Landon Landry

In February, 290 citations were issued, 18 warnings, 2 traffic accidents/incidents, and 21 complaints were responded to. Total fines collected: \$71,049.

There was a wonderful turnout for the Mardi Gras Parade. Many thanks to all the volunteers who assisted with the security and food.

Due to an increase in accidents on the Atchafalaya Basin, interstate closures have resulted in traffic being rerouted to US Highway 190. A traffic control plan was previously implemented involving multiple agencies; however, the Livonia Police Department appears to be the only agency still participating, creating operational challenges.

Public Works and Utilities – Ricky David

Installation of the new meter program began today and is expected to take approximately 6–8 weeks to complete.

Council Members' Reports by Department

- **Junk, Park, and Recreation (Brian Bergeron):** Cement walkways have been completed at Glaser's Park. WeeBall registration has begun. Seven properties remain pending for junk compliance. The court ruled the property at 3237 LA Highway 78 (Scott Bergeron) guilty and ordered compliance or appeal of the magistrate's decision.
- **Drainage & Streets (Terry Jarreau):** Streets in Richfield Subdivision have been repaved. Residents on David Street have requested the replacement of speed bumps. A petition is circulating for speed bumps on Perkins and Cooley Streets.
- **Beautification & Abandoned Buildings (Twanna LeJeune):** The Eli Kline Estate at 8895 Glaser Street is expected to be sold to an heir, after which the abandoned structure will be taken care of.
- **Water & Abandoned Vehicles (Mr. Lorne Webre):** Four nuisance vehicles are pending.

ADJOURNMENT

Ms. LeJeune made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Bergeron seconded the motion, and it carried. The meeting adjourned at 8:09 p.m.
